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ABOUT THE FILMS

DABBAWALLA

Director: Daniel Klein and Mirra Fine

Each day in Mumbai 4000 men in white outfits and matching hats transport 175,000 lunches across the big city. They retrieve the tiffens (lunch containers) of food from mothers and wives, and bring them (by foot, train, bicycle and even carried on top of their heads) to the office buildings of waiting husbands and sons. The Dabbawallas have been doing this since the late 1800s. Despite the unsophisticated mode of transport, the lunches always arrive on time (the error rate is 1 in every 16 million transactions). It's a pretty impressive feat and we were lucky enough to follow a couple Dabbawallas for a day in Mumbai, and see their work first hand.

DILLI

Director: Sushmit Ghosh and Rintu Thomas

"Dilli" is a short documentary film produced by the Robin Raina Foundation (RRF), about the hidden faces behind the so called development of Delhi and their untold story. The film is being premiered at the NASDAQ in Times Square, New York on April 1, 2011 following the ringing of the NASDAQ closing bell by Robin Raina, Founder RRF. "Dilli" brings out a stark comparison of the rampant progress and development of the megalopolis vis-à-vis thousands who are left homeless while the whole city is modernized and revamped. "Dilli" records and documents the evacuation of the thousands who in a matter of minutes lost their homes, and were left in a sea of rubble with nowhere to go and no ray of hope for a better tomorrow. Director Sushmit Ghosh and Rintu Thomas eloquently weave this untold story of mass exodus of thousands who were bulldozed from their homes and transferred to a makeshift facade - Bawana without water, shelter or drainage while the city was redone for Commonwealth Games 2010. RRF is presently carrying out the largest private charity home building initiative in the Indian sub-continent, in terms of building 6000 homes, free of cost, for the underprivileged slum dwellers of Delhi.

LEAF OF FAITH

Leaf of Faith tells the story of a temple built around a tree in the heart of Toa Payoh. This documentary raises the question of whether faith alone is enough to sustain the running of the temple.

PULAU UBIN

A short documentary on Pulau Ubin, the second largest offshore island of Singapore. Located on the north east of the city-state, the island remains one of its rare natural spots. Recent development plans may change this place that has been adored not just by nature-lovers, but also by its residents.

人情位: PLACE FOR COMMUNITY

The traditional provision shop is a symbol of community and heartland heritage. However, increased competition from supermarkets and other convenience stores has led to the decline of this trade. There is no place for such provision shops in society anymore as they are slowly dying out.

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KAMPONG BUANGKOK, SINGAPORE

Located at the northeastern part of Singapore, is the last surviving village on the island. Although the kampong is regularly affected by floods, while infrastructure services and distance to amenities are constantly challenging. However, residents still continue to enjoy the life setting in the village and build their identities based on the locality.

MR LONG'S TRAVELLING CINEMA

For the last 50 years, Mr Long has entertained people on the streets of Hanoi with his own home-made style of storytelling – relying mainly on good old-fashioned ingenuity and some low-tech gadgetry to provide a multi-sensory experience for his audience. Mr Long projects paper cut-out images, then diffuses various aromas, simulates wind and rain with fans and water bottles, even producing sound effects with tin cans and string. But on the occasion of Hanoi's millennial celebrations, Mr Long wants to tell a story that will reach multiple audiences – using computer animation. The programme reveals the remarkable life story of Hanoi's charismatic raconteur.

CILIWUNG LARUNG

The Bukit Duri Community on the banks of Ciliwung River constantly faces environmental challenges and social marginalisation. In the shadow of a corrupt country and the power of corrupt officials, residents construct a communal space in which they can conduct cultural activities, have regular meetings, read in a small library, and obtain health services. In 2010, residents joined together to craft, rehearse, and perform "Ciliwung Larung", a musical, at Taman Ismail Marzuki in Jakarta. The musical theater is a representation of their life experiences as Ciliwung residents.

TRONG PHUONG THANH CONG CO LANG THANH CONG

Community loudspeakers are put around town to broadcast official messages from the People's Committee to the residents of Thanh Cong Village in Vietnam. What happens when information sharing becomes a noisy exercise? The film captures the experiences of residents in Thanh Cong and members of the Thanh Cong People's Committee around the loudspeakers on a street corner.
