Short Biography

Abdul Jaleel is a Research Fellow associated with the Muhammad Alagil Chair in the Inter-Asia Engagements Cluster at the Asia Research Institute of the National University of Singapore. With a keen focus on the history, culture and literary traditions of Arab communities in South India and Southeast Asia, he explores broader aspects of the Arabia Asia engagements. Over the last few years, he has been researching and documenting the historical as well as intellectual traditions and cultural expressions of Arab and other Asian societies in South India. Prior to this, he taught West Asian Studies at the University of Kerala and was a Visiting Research Fellow at BGSMCS, Free University Berlin. His ongoing book project traces the history of religious cultivation of Muslim communities in South India by examining a set of categories that contributed to the development of Sufi religiosity across the historical coastal regions of the Indian Ocean.
