Tim's work addresses how the past comes to be constructed and reconstructed for public audiences and for diplomatic, geopolitical and nationalistic purposes. He has led the development of heritage diplomacy as a cross-disciplinary concept and introduced geocultural power to the analysis of international affairs. His recent articles on these topics have appeared in *Geopolitics*, *International Affairs*, *International Journal of Cultural Policy*, and *Environment and Planning D*. His latest books are *Geocultural Power: China's Quest to Revive the Silk Roads for the Twenty First Century* (University of Chicago Press 2019) and *The Silk Road: Connecting Histories and Futures* (Oxford University Press, 2022).
