Short Biography

Wei YANG is a Postdoctoral Fellow with the Asian Migration Cluster. She received her PhD in Sociology from Nanyang Technological University. Her PhD thesis examined

the lived experiences of mainland Chinese female migrant workers employed in the manufacturing and service sectors in Singapore. Her thesis explores the diversity of migrant women's social and intimate lives beyond the workplace and how they negotiate with Singapore's temporary migrant labour regime under global capitalism to advance their own projects of social mobility and reproduction. As a sociologist and migration scholar, she is particularly interested in examining the entangled relationships between social and spatial mobilities, between the global and the intimate. Her work has been published in journals such as *Pacific Affairs*, *Gender*, *Place & Culture*, *Journal of Ethnic and Migration Studies* and *Ethnic and Racial Studies*. She also conducted research on middle-class immigrant parenting and integration in Singapore. At ARI, she will develop her PhD thesis into a book. She will also be involved in an ongoing project on cross-national families in Singapore.
