He will work on his research project titled "Global Gasification: The Emergence of the Indonesian Natural Gas Frontier and the Making of Commodity Network Between Indonesia and Japan (1960s–1990s)". This project is partly related to his dissertation, *Living in the Ruins of the Capitalocene*, which is being developed into a book manuscript.
