### Director's Foreword Focus on Southeast Asia

The past few months have seen a focus on Southeast Asia, with many of our scholars presenting at conferences in the region. Both the 13th International Convention of Asia Scholars (ICAS) and the 2024 Association for Asian Studies (AAS) in Asia Conference were held in Indonesia in July.

Internally, ARI hosted the <u>19<sup>th</sup> Singapore Graduate Forum on Southeast Asian Studies</u>. The Graduate Forum covers humanities and social science research relating to Southeast Asia – defined as ASEAN member countries plus East Timor – and is principally designed for scholars from the region. Comprised of a two-week virtual fellowship of skills-based sessions covering academic writing, presentation skills and publication strategies, the forum culminates in an inperson graduate student conference, where participants have the opportunity to present and receive feedback on their research.

In July, ARI also brought together established field leaders as part of a nascent <u>Southeast Asian Studies Collaboratory</u>, an initiative that emerged from ARI's long-standing partnership with the Henry Luce Foundation, a supporter of Asian Studies for over 80 years. The event connected regional scholars, research centers, current and former Luce grantees, practitioners, and Luce representatives with ARI researchers and other Southeast Asianists from NUS. This enabled identification and discussion of current research trends and capacity needs that could benefit from future collaborative projects involving ARI and the Luce Foundation.









Alongside our events and new collaborative initiatives, ARI experienced a leadership transition, as <u>Professor Chong Chi Tat</u> stepped down after nearly twenty years as Chair of the Management Board. Professor Chong's commitment to excellence has been instrumental in driving ARI's success. His leadership has enabled the consolidation of a culture of research innovation, and academic rigour. We welcome <u>Professor Joanne Roberts</u> as the new Chair. Currently President

of Yale-NUS College, Professor Roberts brings a wealth of experience and has been an ARI Management Board member since January 2021.

We have also had the opportunity to host a member of the International Advisory Board, Professor Michele Ford, as a visitor in the Institute's Asian Migration and Asian Urbanisms clusters. A Professor of Southeast Asian Studies at the University of Sydney, Professor Ford has been an IAB member since 2017.


